



NHSA is engaging in a multi-year campaign to increase public understanding of Head Start's effectiveness in driving successful outcomes for America's most vulnerable children and families — also known as the "Head Start Advantage." The first product to come out of this initiative is the new Head Start Language Playbook. This Playbook is intended to help Head Start staff, parents, and alumni have better, more effective conversations about our mission with the public. In this training, participants will learn how to use the tips in the Playbook better communicate the power of Head Start: who we are, what we do, and why it matters. Through interactive teaching methods such as role-playing, participants will also learn how to tailor their message to specific audiences, including elected officials/policymakers, k-12 school administrators, and anyone in general who may be skeptical about Head Start.

Rosenblatt, licensed to practice law in the District of Columbia, Founder of Grants Counsel Description: In this session, we'll cover legal hot topics that Head Start Directors should have on their radars, such as: * common review findings (and how to make sure your program's legal rights are protected), * the Uniform Guidance (and the policies and procedures you need in place to prevent serious deficiency findings), * recent trends in governance (and how to draft effective impasse procedures that won't immobilize your program); * DRS (and the infamous CLASS trigger); and * under-enrollment (what OHS has been doing and how you can position yourself for success, whether you've struggled with under-enrollment or not). You'll come away from the session with a to-do list to better manage your program's legal risk.
